



Cromer Road Primary School Breakfast Club/After School Club Supervisor (Grade A) Job Description & Personal Spec

You will be required to assist with the planning, day-to-day organisation and operation of the club, providing high quality play opportunities and care for children in an inclusive environment, and in accordance with the ethos of the school.

You will work as part of a team in liaison and co-operation with the club leader, class teachers, parents and governors.

General:

- supervising the welfare and safety of children during the club hours
- assisting with the handover/collection of children to/from other areas of the school, where applicable
- ensuring pupils' safe handover to parents/carers at the end of the day, communicating any relevant information
- setting up and laying the tables for breakfast/tea
- being aware of any child's dietary needs such as allergies, intolerance, cultural or religious
- preparing food and drink that promotes healthy eating, and complies with current school food guidelines and food safety legislation
- assisting with day to day administration and record keeping
- working as part of the staff team contributing to the promotion of the club
- supporting pupils' independence by encouraging good social behaviour at mealtimes, such as use of cutlery
- maintaining high standards of hygiene at all times
- pre-planning and initiating play activities in the playground
- communicating according to pupil's needs such as culture, age, additional support or needs
- being aware of, and catering for any pupil's additional needs, such as autism, or diabetes during the club hours
- ensuring that any equipment is used safely
- ensuring that all tasks are carried out in accordance with the Borough and school health and safety statements
- reporting any health and safety concerns to your manager as soon as practicable.

Behaviour:

- assisting in maintaining a high standard of behaviour amongst pupils
- dealing with any disagreements between pupils in a fair manner in accordance with the school's behaviour policy
- reporting any incident to the class teacher or appropriate person and completing incident reports
- encouraging and motivating good behaviour through playing games
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- occasional exposure to outbursts of challenging behaviour from pupils, such as biting, kicking, hitting

First Aid:

- attending to the first aid needs of pupils and maintaining records of first aid treatment given [as appropriate]

Professional Development:

- attending relevant safeguarding training
- having a knowledge of relevant school policies such as child protection, health and safety, equal opportunities, and behaviour
- having knowledge of food allergies
- having knowledge of cultural and religious dietary requirements
- being willing to undertake training and attend courses as required

To carry out any other duties connected with the supervision of pupils during club hours as requested by the Headteacher.

You should comment on the IMPACT of your work and experience to date that shows how you meet these requirements when you fill in your application form and prepare your supporting statement.
